To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

In recent times, the idea of vocation, especially that of police and soldiers has been a major topic of discussion. There is an age-old question? Can a soldier be a faithful child of God? In 1526, Martin Luther wrote a brilliant piece entitled, "Whether Soldiers, Too, Can Be Saved." In Luther's day, the soldiers functioned as both the army and police. It is not a new question. There are those in our society who are asked to do things that the Word of God says "Thou shalt not do." On the battlefield, a soldier can be commanded to kill and destroy property. If someone other than a soldier would kill or destroy property, they would rightfully be thrown into jail. Yet, the work of the soldiers is seen as being done under the governing authority that Scripture says God has established. A soldier can fight, even kill, and still be a faithful child of God.

The role of the police is much more difficult to define. The police are given the mandate "To Protect and to Serve." This involves guarding the innocent and the most vulnerable. This mandate also can require violence similar to what is expected of a soldier.

As I have no personal experience with the vocation of soldier or policeman, it is a challenge to fully grasp the balance of their mandate to stand in harm's way, deal with evildoers, and strive to see that the least harm possible is done to others.

In Mellen, WI we have good friends whose daughter, as a rookie police officer, was attacked by an unarmed man. She chose not to shoot him. He wrestled with her and shot her with her own gun. Thankfully, there were some civilians who came to her aid and her wound was not life-threatening.

While living in Pana, I had another friend who had been part of a deep undercover narcotics team in Baltimore, MD. He retired early after killing the head of a drug cartel in a firefight that claimed the life of his partner. His family room had shelves lined with marksmanship awards and trophies. All of them were first-place trophies. I asked him about them. He simply said, "I never miss." He didn't retire because he ended someone else's life. He was comfortable with that being part of his vocation – he spent months at a time in Iraq as part of a sniper team embedded with the military. However, the reason he retired from police duty, what he couldn't live with, was that in the firefight with the drug cartel, he had the opportunity to end the fight with one more shot, but he missed. He killed the last drug dealer on the scene with one more shot, but in the meantime, that man killed his partner.

He moved to Pana to find comfort in his extended family. I like to think that he found comfort in our friendship and especially in the words of the Gospel shared during those years.

In this sinful world, we will never perform any of our vocations perfectly or find perfection outside of the perfect mercy found in Christ. I can't imagine being in a life-and-death situation as described above, or being a soldier on a battlefield, or entering a burning building with a firehose. There are vocations that a select few are chosen to do which allows the rest of us to live out our vocations in life as workers, students, fathers, mothers, sons, daughters, a children of God. Whatever is your chosen vocation, do it to the best of your ability, do it to the glory of God, and do it for the good of your neighbor.

UPDATE Inkjet Cartridge Recycling: We have had an overflowing response to the ink cartridge recycling project. Recently, **106 cartridges were donated** to the collection box at church, and mailed off to Planet Green Recycling. We will be receiving a **check for \$88.75** for our recycling efforts! Those funds will be **sent to the Uganda Mission**! This is **in addition to the \$12.75 check** that we received earlier this year. Each cartridge is examined for it's value. Even the ones which they cannot use and refill we will **receive 25 cents** each for our effort. Your combined efforts of simply recycling your inkjet cartridges will result in a larger sum being sent to Uganda. Here are ways you can help:

1. Bring your used INKJET cartridges and deposit them in the collection box outside of the church office. OR 2. If you prefer to mail your own cartridges (at least 7) you can do so by using our **PROGRAM ID: 31683** at <u>planetgreenrecycle.com</u> to request a **FREE USPS label** to print and then mail.

College Care Packages - The first college care packages of the school year are on their way to 11 students and 2 National Guard members! These are being sent to our sons and daughters attending college, locally or elsewhere, or are currently serving in the military. If you have not already submitted the information this school year for your son or daughter, please do so as soon as possible so that we can include them in future mailings. We will need the name of the college student or military member along with their college address or base mailing address.

If you would like to donate items for care packages, we will have a collection bin near the south entrance. Here are some ideas of items: gum, chocolate candy bars, Skittles, Sour Patch, tic-tacs, mints, Ramen noodle cups, oatmeal cups or packets, granola bars, protein bars, drink mix packets, dried fruit, trail mix, hot chocolate mix packets, pop tarts, individual bags of chips, pens, post it notes, pudding cups, microwave popcorn, small hand sanitizers, eyeglass cleaner wipes, pocket size Kleenex, travel size hand lotion, cough drops, ponytail holders, toothbrushes, laundry pods, band aids, mini slim jims (beef jerky,) granola bars, fruit/cereal bars, keurig type k-cups, etc. Collection of items will be ongoing throughout the year.
