Since this is such a rare disorder, insurance will cover only a small portion of doctor costs and the ongoing medication that Sutton needs to be able to digest food.

## Going from win/lose to win/win

Following a quarrel with your spouse, partner, child or parent, do you ever feel guilty or wish you'd done things differently? Too often we fight with one goal in mind - to win. But if there is a winner, there also has to be a loser. In a win/lose situation, someone wins, someone loses and usually both parties end up hurting.

Many of us as we grew up were taught that to fight is to battle for "rightness." If I am to get my point across or to stand up for my beliefs, I have to fight until I change your perspective to mine. That way, I win and you lose.

In any relationship, there will invariably be conflict. We are all individuals with differing perspectives, personalities, expectations, backgrounds and life experiences. There will be times of disagreement and times when we need to take a stand on our differences. Conflict and differences can be good.

Differences do not have to destroy a relationship; rather, they can give us energy to make necessary changes, and they can bring us closer together as we learn to understand one another better.

Here are some ways to help steer the outcome of a conflict to win/win, not win/lose:

- Listen to the other person, especially in very difficult situations. It's natural for all of us to want to say what we think, but we also need to allow the other person to express his/her views.
- Allow the other person to express his/her needs and feelings.
- Put into words what you think you heard the other person say.
- Highlight the good things you perceive in the other person.
- Acknowledge your differences.
- Find a time to talk that is not in the heat of battle.
- Agree to disagree.

Being in a relationship can be tough, but differences can make a relationship even better. It takes practice to build a healthy relationship. It takes practice to disagree in healthy, rather than destructive ways. It's important to find ways to face off with win/win in mind.
