The service will begin at **3:17 PM** (which is 1517 in military time) followed by a potluck dinner.

Quincy Area Shoebox Packing Party – 3rd Annual Sunday afternoon, **October 29, 2017 at 2:30 PM** at St. John's, 3340 State Street to introduce new groups to Operation Christmas Child & pack 500 shoeboxes.

With the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in mind, the Quincy Concert Band presents a truly uplifting concert "LUX" celebrating the idea of light in the church, in the world, and in the soul. This **FREE CONCERT** takes place in the Morrison Theater in the Quincy Junior High School Auditorium on **October 29th at 2:30pm**. The concert band, under the baton of conductor, Dr. Trent Hollinger, will open in true Renaissance style with a Giovanni Gabrieli brass choir work from 1597. Canzon Septimi Toni No. 2 from Sacrae Symphoniae will be performed by two groups of brass instruments on both sides of the auditorium, replicating the original way this work would have been heard in St. Mark's Cathedral in Venice. Also in the first half, you will hear Bach's If Thou Be Near; Kathryn Salfelder's Cathedrals; Lux Aurumque (Light and Gold) by Eric Whitacre; and Rejouissance by James Curnow. The second half of our concert will be dedicated to the composer David Maslanka, who died in August of this year. The Quincy Concert Band will perform his entire 2006 two-movement symphony, Give Us This Day.
