Thanks to the many who donated to the ORLC St. James School Tuition Endowment Fund during the **\$5,000 match** challenge. Our goal was met and surpassed! Total contributions amounted to **\$6,477**.

When our committee was established in 2016, our goal was to create an endowment that would be used to supplement the ORLC budget line item for St. James Tuition. We started actually collecting money for the Fund in December of 2018 and currently have **approximately \$262,000 invested** with LCMS Foundation **and another \$20,000** in our bank account to send to the LCMS Foundation. *How do we fund the endowment?* Solicit seed money from congregation members, promote estate planning to include this endowment, direct mail to St James School alumnae and their families, Thrivent Choice Dollars, encourage church groups to participate, and seek grants from friendly foundations and businesses.
