NOTICE OF SPECIAL VOTERS MEETING ON SUNDAY, JULY 31, 2022, AT 10:15 AM

On July 13, 2022, at a special Church Council meeting, the Council heard a report from our member, Bill Humphrey, on problems with our church electrical system, what can be done about them, and the estimated cost, as well as possible consequences for not addressing them. Some of the problems have existed for many years, even from 1962 when the Sanctuary was built, under building codes and practices that existed at the time. The Council believes we have come to the point where the aging, now substandard system with the existing and potential problems should be recognized by the congregation and a decision made about what to do.

The cost of fixing the problems and upgrading the system is significant. Bill's current rough estimate is about \$43,000, which is an amount that must be approved by the Voters Assembly if it is to be spent. It should be noted that there may be additional costs, such as additional materials and work that may be discovered to be necessary as the work goes on, as well as increases in material costs that may occur.

The Council has recommended to the Voters that they approve the proposed work. Our next scheduled regular Voters Meeting is on September 25. In an effort to address the problems in an orderly fashion before certain of them result in a lengthy power outage and additional problems, including possible damage to the structure and electronics, we are scheduling this Special Voters Meeting for Sunday, July 31, 2022, at 10:15 am, in the Sanctuary immediately following the Sunday morning service. Additional information will be provided at that time, including a more accurate estimate of the costs after Bill has had a chance to contact material providers.
