ST. JAMES LUTHERAN SCHOOL, QUINCY, IL https://www.stjamesquincyschool.org Beyond the Classroom is being held at St. James on Saturday, February 25; 10 am - 2 pm. The CID Office will present the Beyond the Classroom introduction module in five regions within the District. These presentations are an introduction to the program that will encourage congregations or associations with schools to reach out to the unchurched and de-churched families in their school communities. Most of our churches consider their schools as one of their major outreach programs. Over time many of our schools have had a marked increase in enrollment from de-churched/unchurched families. Beyond the Classroom, an application of the Synod's Connect to Disciple module by Dr. Mark Wood, will help schools and congregations review, evaluate, and develop their outreach activities. With Beyond the Classroom's assistance, congregations are encouraged to make outreach efforts in connection with their schools. The backbone of this training is that the school will learn to understand the difference between outreach and witnessing. The training will help them determine what makes for effective outreach within their school communities. And finally, it will use the tools to develop valuable and effective outreach pathways and be able to evaluate and adjust these pathways as needed. As we plan for these introductory training modules, we are looking at the following area locations and dates. These training goals are to generate interest and create a "knowledge base" in Connect to Disciple and the Beyond the Classroom application among CID churches with schools and preschools.
