#### NOTICE OF SPECIAL VOTERS' ASSEMBLY MEETING ON FEBRUARY 26, 2023

10:15 AM, in the Sanctuary immediately following the Sunday service to consider the Church Council's recommendations that the Voters authorize budgets to be paid from the Building Fund:

 Not to exceed \$4,200 to Powell Brothers Plumbing for the removal of certain existing plumbing fixtures in the two main floor restrooms and installation of three new high-rise toilets, four new wall mounted sinks, and four new single handle faucets in those bathrooms; and
Not to exceed \$1,800 to Moore's Floors for the purpose of installing new floor tile in the two main floor restrooms.

Both of the recommendations for these improvements are based on bids received from the two contractors. Per the Bylaws, the Voters' Assembly must consider and approve all expenditures over \$1,000.
