Inkjet Cartridge Recycling: We have had an overflowing response to the ink cartridge recycling project. Recently, 106 cartridges were donated to the collection box at church, and mailed off to Planet Green Recycling. At the end of the guarter, ORLC will receive a check of which the funds will be sent to the Uganda Mission! Earlier this year, some folks mailed their own cartridges to Planet Green using our code, and that check for \$12.75 will be arriving soon. Each cartridge is examined for its value. Even the ones which they cannot use and refill we will receive 25 cents each for our effort. We will keep you posted once we know the value of the recent shipment. Your combined efforts of simply recycling your inkjet cartridges will result in a larger sum being sent to Uganda.

During the town hall, we will: •Provide a brief overview of SAS; •Share what we learned working with the pilot participants; Introduce resources and tools to help congregations, schools, and camps with raising up the next generation of church workers; and •Provide next steps on how to make SAS work in your congregation. **Moonlight Ride for Hunger Saturday, Augusts 26, 2023** This family-friendly event benefits Horizons Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry. The ride begins with a four-mile trek across both Quincy bridges, with an optional extended route that takes you up the Bill Klingner Bike Trail and back again for a total of 12 miles. Horizons feeds over 32,000 people in the food pantry and serves over 50,000 meals through the kitchen each year. Located at 224 South 8th Street in Quincy, IL, our ministry is at the epicenter of the need of impoverished people in Adams County. Registration is required for all events and 100% of all proceeds (*after expenses*) from the Ride go to Horizons to outreach to the needy in Quincy and the surrounding area!
