Due to unforeseen circumstances, the 2023 Moonlight Ride for Hunger will no longer include a ride across the bridges of Quincy. We are disappointed that this has to change at the last moment, yet we're still excited to see you as part of this year's fundraiser. Plus, we are expanding our age range to anyone 10 to 16 years of age who can ride for free, with a paid adult.

The Moonlight Ride for Hunger is a family-friendly community event that benefits the Horizons Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry. The ride begins at Clat Adams Park, through the Bill Klingner Bike Trail, and back to Clat Adams Park for a total of 8 miles.

The Moonlight Ride for Hunger is an annual event to raise money for Horizons Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry. As you know, our team here at Horizons feeds over 32,000 people in our food pantry and serves over 50,000 meals through our kitchen each year. Located at 224 South 8th Street in Quincy, IL, our ministry is at the epicenter of the need of impoverished people in Adams County.

Registration is required for all events and 100% of all proceeds (*after expenses*) from the Moonlight Ride for Hunger go to Horizons for use in our outreach to the needy in Quincy and the surrounding area! Please note that the registration fee for the Adult Bike Ride increases to \$40 if you wait until the day of the race to register. **Online registration ends on August 25th**, after which you will need to register at Madison Davis or at the event itself. The registration booth will open at 5:30 PM on August 26th for anyone who needs to still register. The ride starts promptly at 7:00 PM.
