### To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

In 1524, Martin Luther translated the Psalms into German. He had published the New Testament in 1522 and the five books of Moses in 1523. So, this year marks the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Lutherans singing and reading the Psalms in their own language. The entire Old Testament would not be completed until 1534.

Christ's church has so many events to celebrate and remember that many of the truly important events of the past get overlooked. However, we are not simply a people dwelling on the things of the past. Our future is where our true hope and joy is found.

We continue our celebration of the Resurrection of our Lord, but Easter is not simply an event of the past. We are Easter people now and forever. We have other celebrations certainly worthy of our attention this month with Mother's Day, Ascension Day, and Memorial Day. Those days are worth remembering and acknowledging for obviously different reasons.

However the greatest event celebrated in the month of May, and the one which is necessary for all other events to be meaningful, happens each Saturday, Sunday, and most Wednesday's as we gather at the Lord's altar to receive Christ's body and blood.

Whether the Words of Institution are spoken in German, English, Greek, or Aramaic, they are the purest presentation of the Gospel we will ever hear. Christ's broken body and shed blood are given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. As Luther states in his Small Catechism, "These words, 'Given and shed for you for the forgiveness of sins,' show us that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation."

Without this promise, there would be nothing to celebrate. There would be no reason to instruct our youth concerning the Gospel, and the memory of Luther's translation of the Bible would be recognizing nothing more than 500 years of futility if there is no forgiveness of sin through Christ's bodily sacrifice and the new covenant established in His blood – which is the Gospel.

Our Redeemer Lutheran Church is a sacramental community. We are a people of Word and Sacrament. We are recognized as Christ's Church because the Word is proclaimed and the Sacraments are administered. Nothing else that goes on in this community would be of any consequence if these Means of Grace were neglected.

So, rejoice in the forgiveness, life, and salvation promised in Christ. Continue to proclaim "Christ is risen!! He is risen indeed!! Alleluia!! And please do not ever neglect the broken body and shed blood of Christ which has covered the guilt of our sin. Our Lord Himself compels us in saying, "Do this in remembrance of Me."
