To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

Malinda and I were blessed to take two long vacations this year. The first was so that we could attend two weddings, one in Orlando Florida, one in Ft. Wayne Indiana on consecutive weekends. The second trip was to Cape Cod (among other places) to celebrate our 30th wedding anniversary. On both trips, we went places and did things which we had never done before and time seemed to move very slowly (in a good way).

On Monday April 8, we packed up and left for our first vacation. That was also the day of the total eclipse. I stood with Malinda in a parking lot just off of US 41 north of Evansville Indiana and watched the total eclipse of the sun. It was an amazing event. The beauty and complexity of God's creation was on full display.

The corona around the sun coupled with the sky being like it was at twilight with a sunset just having disappeared was awe-inspiring. But of all the things that caught my attention, it was the quiet of the moment. US 41 is a chaotic four lane highway full of trucks and construction zones. There were no vehicles on the road. If you have ever been on US 41 at 2:00 PM on a Monday afternoon, having no vehicles on the road and no traffic noise is more rare than a total eclipse of the sun. The Psalmist says, "Be still, and know that I am God." This one event got the entire region to stop and look to the heavens.

The highlight of our last vacation was a three hour whale watching excursion off the coast of Cape Cod. We were blessed to see a dozen different humpback whales with one of them breaching three times right in front of where Malinda and I were standing. (You can see pictures of this on my Facebook page). Those three hours felt like ten hours (in a good way). We thanked God over and over for allowing the beauty and complexity of His creation to be on display in those magnificent mysterious creatures.

In addition to the joy of seeing these enormous creations of God, being out on the water brings a relative sense of quiet. All that you really hear is the sound of the wind and the water. There is great blessing in finding a quiet, solitary place for time to look to the heavens or give thanks to God. When your life is looking like US 41 on a typical Monday afternoon, take the time to stop and look to the heavens and be still.

These are just two of some of the responses received when asked, "How has receiving the care packages made you feel?" In the coming weeks and months, we will share more responses from the students as well as some information about who we are sending packages to and where! We are preparing for college care packages for the school year! Our inventory starts from scratch each year, and appreciate all donations for the program. The members of ORLC can help by donating items for the packages, making a monetary donation to the College Care Package fund at ORLC (which helps cover supplies and postage costs), signing cards that are sent in each package for every student, and keeping them in your prayers! There will be a collection bin near the south entrance where you can drop in donated items.
