Pastor Troxel was admitted to Methodist Hospital in Des Moines. He had a gastric emptying study and learned that he had been incapable of swallowing anything orally, so food and drink weren't getting to his stomach. A PICC line was inserted to provide Total Parenteral Nutrition (calories, protein, fat, vitamins & hydration). There are 2 ports: one for nutrition and one for blood draws, meds, etc. This is to strengthen him for chemo which is on hold because he is too weak. The Palliative care team is also involved with his care. Donna is greatly relieved and thankful that Pastor will finally be getting calculated hydration and nutrition. He's still very mentally alert and has been participating in all decisions. He has a very positive attitude about going forward with whatever it takes to help him more than survive and get as well as he can be on this side of eternity. Donna and Pastor are so very appreciative of all the prayers. Please reach out to them if you can and let them know that you are concerned and praying.

Right now Pastor Troxel is still weak and receiving nutrition through either an IV or a feeding tube. He was also diagnosed with aspiration pneumonia.

Again, Pastor and Donna are very grateful and blessed for all those who are keeping them and their family in prayer. God bless you.

The LCMS has actively participated in other FACT and EPIC studies over the last twenty years and benefited from their research's insights. Please keep in mind that this survey was designed to be broadly applicable to a wide range of church bodies across America. Because of this, you can expect that the wording, at times, may not precisely align with confessional Lutheran perspectives and practices. We see this as all the more reason to make sure the confessional Lutheran voice is well-represented in this national survey effort. The survey will remain open through the end of November.



Our CID mission goal is \$110,000, of which \$82,500 is for our grants and the remainder for our national mission grants.


Sharing Christ with Women & Children in Kazakhstan - \$100,000
