To the people of God at Our Redeemer,

I want to follow up on what I wrote about last month in regard to personal daily devotion and being in the Word outside of regular corporate worship. As I relayed to you, over the years, I have adjusted my routine with varying degrees of success. Having given more thought to the subject, the reality is that periodically adjusting your schedule can be helpful. Doing something different is often a way to "recharge your batteries." This is why we travel. Making even small adjustments to our schedule can reinvigorate a person. There is actually scientific evidence that doing something you have not done before causes your brain chemistry to actually experience positive changes.

In fact, a recent study suggests that doing something you have never done before actually makes it seem as if time is moving slower. We experience this whenever we drive somewhere for the first time. The drive home seems so much shorter. It is suggested by the authors of the study that the reason the years seem to move faster and faster the older we get is because the younger we are the more opportunity we have for first time experiences.

This brings me to God's Word and daily devotions. Recently I have been asked for ideas for daily devotions for an individual and for a family. Again, in my experience, if whatever you are doing does not involve reading something from the Bible itself, you are not totally wasting your time, but you are certainly wasting an opportunity to consume the most beneficial spiritual food outside of the Sacrament of the Altar.

That being said, I can say with confidence that it pays dividends to switch things up. Don't neglect Luther's Catechism. There are useful publications such as Portals of Prayer or Good News Magazine. Going through my parents' books, Malinda found a daily devotional that she is excited to explore.

One thing that has not changed since my youth is that I cannot fall asleep at night until I have at least said the Apostle's Creed and the Lord's Prayer.

The point I am trying to make is that there is no absolute formula for personal devotion. First and foremost, be in worship on Wednesday, Saturday, and/or Sunday and gather with the people of God around Word and Sacrament.

Gathering around Word and Sacrament (the Means of Grace) is what we do. After that, make use of God's Word and faithful books. Get involved in a Bible class. Read your catechism. If you have a Book of Concord, read that. Concordia Publishing House is a good resource for numerous devotional books. Feed yourself with good spiritual food, and exercise your faith in worship and prayer. If you lack either food or exercise, it is difficult to remain healthy.

Summer is coming. Schedules will be changing. Take advantage of the opportunity to change your schedule and get even more connected to God's Word and Christ's Church.
