History Hints – Do You Remember? In 1953

the vacant Canton church (this church had combined with the LaGrange parish) was to be torn down and the bronze bell was offered to Our Redeemer free of charge. A free-standing tower (campanile) was made of oak timbers from Edgar and Reginald Pflantz's farm at Taylor, MO. The November 8, 1953 issue of the Quincy Herald-Whig name this **"Quincy's first campanile."** The bell bears the date "1884" and a verse in German which translates to:

"Only to God's glory do I wish to be heard." It was cast by Henry Stuckstede & Co. in St. Louis, MO. The company, famous for its bells, was in business from 1855 to 1931.

A **free Bible study on mercy**, titled "Feed My Lambs," is available from The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod for use in home, school or church settings.

The purpose of the five-session study, which was written by LCMS President Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, is to explore how members of the body of Christ demonstrate love and compassion to people in need as an expression of faith.

"Large or small, our acts of mercy flow from our living faith in Christ," Harrison writes in Session 1. "We respond to His love for us by acting in love and compassion toward others."

The study examines key Bible verses, as well as pertinent passages from Martin Luther, to help participants come to a biblical understanding of mercy and consider the outcomes of their actions. "Feed My Lambs" was originally published in 2003. The new version has been re-edited and is available for free download at lcms.org.
