We are preparing for college care packages for the school year! Our inventory starts from scratch each year, and appreciate all donations for the program. The members of ORLC can help by donating items for the packages, making a monetary donation to the College Care Package fund at ORLC (which helps cover supplies and postage costs), signing cards that are sent in each package for every student, and keeping them in your prayers! There will be a collection bin near the south entrance where you can drop in donated items.
