Dear Members, In the January Voter's Meeting Chet Vahle gave the first reading of changes to the ORLC constitution and bylaws. These changes include the change to a not-for-profit organization. To adopt these changes, a majority of the voting membership is required at the April 27, 2025, 10:15 AM meeting. This is approximately 55 registered voters.
